THE MISSING CHRIST



Only last Saturday, 10th December President Higgins gave the first of his Annual Christmas themed addresses at the annual lighting of the Christmas tree at Áras an Uachtaráin. In what was an emotive appeal for peace and joy between family and friends, he also issued a reminder not to forget those for whom the season was difficult and those who are less fortunate than ourselves. Whilst it was a commendable and timely reminder of family values and civic duty, it remained on the whole an emotive and fuzzy articulation of what life should be on a daily basis. As in previous years, nothing was mentioned as to what marked out the time of the year as a special time of commemoration and good will.

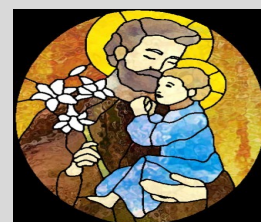
Nowhere in our President's speech was the name Jesus mentioned nor even alluded to. The real reason for the season remained hidden. How telling it is when the President of our country sees fit to give Santa a mention twice and leave the Christ child in the cold. Does that truly represent the Ireland of today? Does that represent the vision our founding volunteers had when they dreamed about a new nation free of shackle and chain? Did they envisage one free of Christ? I really don't think so. Any amount of research will quickly show that their hearts were echoing the words we find in St. Paul's letter this morning. Ireland! You are one of [of many] nations, and by God's call belong to Jesus Christ. Our land is speckled with testaments to our faith both new and ancient. Lest we forget even our world-renowned Proclamation opened with the words: "In the name of God ..."

If previous years are anything to go by, Jesus will not find a place on the pages of some of the 'developed world' leaders festive greetings and speeches and on account of this omission the world and its significance is bereft of a context. It is important to remember, however, that Jesus did not come into the world to simply remain on the pages of a speech or indeed even in a book. He came so that we "may have life and have it to the full" (Jn 10:10). He came so that His first coming would result in His taking up residence within the human heart. The beautiful lyrics of the hymn written by Johann Angelus Silesius presents this notion eloquently when it says "Though Christ a thousand times in Bethlehem be born, If He's not born in thee Thy soul is still forlorn." Do not let this Christmas pass without extending an invitation to the Christ child to come and rest within.
