The Urgent Task

In today's Gospel Jesus sends out 70 disciples in pairs to visit all the towns and villages he himself is to visit. There is a real sense of urgency about the instructions Jesus gives them. They are not to carry a purse or spare set of clothes with them. They are not even to salute anyone on the road. They are to get on with the job of preaching and healing without any distractions or hesitations because the mission they have been given is so important and the harvest, the need is so great.

Jesus warns them too that the mission he is giving them will not be easy. He is sending them out like lambs among wolves. There will be real risks. They will suffer pain and rejection. It will cost them a lot, but that is part of the price of discipleship.

Today, as followers of Jesus, we have been given the same task, the same mission. We are called to proclaim the gospel wherever we go and to do it whatever the difficulty, or risk, or pain involved. The harvest today is just as great as in the time of Jesus. There are so many people crying out for the good news of hope and salvation, of peace and love. There are so many situations of injustice that demand a prophetic response, so many wounded hearts that need the healing touch of Christ.

The harvest is huge and the task is urgent. As co-workers with Christ, we must be reapers of the harvest wherever we live and work and have our being. We must not be afraid of what it costs to witness to the gospel.

Out of this I might reflect on how I am following the Gospel in my own life at the moment! Am I prophetic witness for Jesus Christ?
