The One Who Came Back...

In today's Gospel reading Jesus is approaching a village when he is met by ten people who have a horrible skin disease. According to Jewish Law (Leviticus 13:46), such persons had to be kept away from healthy-skinned people. So these ten lepers keep their distance from Jesus. They know all about him and his reputation as a healer and they beg him for mercy. Jesus does not heal them immediately but tells them to go and present themselves to the priest according to the requirements of Jewish law. On their way they are cured. They are thrilled and excited. Being restored to health is the greatest thing that could happen to them, but even though ten ask for healing, only one takes the time to praise God in thanks. Instead of doing what is required by Law, he comes back to say thanks to Jesus in person. This man also happens to be a Samaritan. Now, Jews had no time for Samaritans; in fact, they hated them. Jews looked down on Samaritans, called them foreigners, and regarded them as religiously inferior. Yet it was this hated Samaritan who had the generosity to say thanks.

Jesus was a Jew and he hated nobody. He was prepared to meet all kinds of people, even Samaritans and those with revolting diseases. His love and compassion extended to all. Listen carefully to today's Gospel. It speaks of the need to be thankful to God for all that God gives us and does for us; it also challenges our attitudes to other people, who because of race, colour, creed, wealth, sexuality or health, are different from us.

Something to reflect upon...

In one sense, we can excuse the behaviour of the nine people in today's Gospel who failed to thank Jesus for what he had done for them. They were so overjoyed at being healed that their first instinct would have been to run home to see their families, from whom they had been separated for a long time. They would have wanted to tell the world that they had been made whole again. They were so thrilled at what happened to them that they probably simply forgot to go back and thank the one who had restored them to health. Can we be sure that we would have behaved any differently if we were in their shoes? Today's Gospel is a timely reminder of the importance of saying thanks, of being grateful. God and others have given us so much.

Do we take them for granted?
