Only in God's Time

For anyone who followed the American election, I'm sure you'd agree that predictions are difficult to make.

Here are some fine examples from times past:

- Thomas Watson, chairman of IBM, in 1943 said, "I think there is a world market for maybe five computers."
- Popular Mechanics magazine in 1949 made this prediction: "Where a calculator on the ENIAC is equipped with 18,000 vacuum tubes and weighs 30 tons, computers in the future may have only 1,000 vacuum tubes and weigh only 1.5 tons."
- There was an inventor by the name of Lee DeForest. He claimed that "While theoretically and technically television may be feasible, commercially and financially it is an impossibility."
- The Decca Recording Co. made a big mistake when they made this prediction: "We don't like their sound, and guitar music is on the way out." That was their prediction in 1962 concerning a few lads form Liverpool. Their band was called the Beatles.

I suggest two learnings from today's Gospel. Firstly, as Jesus told the disciples that not one stone of the temple would be left standing, they were left shocked, the temple was an amazing building I'm sure they said "Look, teacher! What massive stones! What magnificent buildings!" yet forty years later the prediction came true. In 70 AD the Temple was destroyed by Rome. What are we to learn from this prediction and its fulfilment? Perhaps true faith isn't limited to buildings and places like the Temple, our Church or magnificent Cathedrals but is found in the humble heart of the repentant sinner, aware of their need for God's mercy and love.

And secondly be aware of the greatest of all biblical mysteries. In 23 of the 27 New Testament books there is the claim that Christ will one day return but we have no indication of when or what will usher it in. World events do not interfere with God's clock! Wars, earthquakes, international political instability, famine, persecution.....these, says Jesus, are not a sign of the end they are simply facts of life from the beginning.

Do not be alarmed these things must happen; the end is still to come. Be faithful, not afraid.


