# Twenty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time 13th September 2015

No 1512 Mark 8: 27-35





The gospel reading of today is one of the most powerful passages in scripture. Jesus up to this point has been teaching, working miracles and his disciples have been walking with him for a long time. They saw him helping and curing people, eating with the tax collectors and people who were outcasts of society of the time. They heard him proclaim who he was but did they really take this in? They heard what people were saying about this man that they had chosen to be with. They told him who many of the people thought he was.

Then he asked them a direct question.

"Who do you say that I am"

There is no way that they cannot give a straight answer. Peter answered for them when he said "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God"

Now word *Christ* is a translation of the Hebrew word for *Messiah* which many people at the time thought that the *Messiah* would free the Jewish people from Roman occupation. But Jesus tells them exactly what the outcome of his ministry will be, it will be very different from that. He will be rejected, will suffer and will die and will rise after three days. In other words a very different Messiah than was expected. He then goes a step further and says that anyone who follows him must take up their own cross.

Today if we were asked the same question how would we answer. Who is Jesus for us? What does it

mean to be a follower of Jesus today? Do we follow his way of living, of giving, of his compassion for those in need or who ask us for help. To be a follower is to do all these things in our lives. We cannot just pay lip service as Christians. Christ calls us to a life living with and for others.

Today we are faced with a story that is worldwide news, that of the huge numbers

fleeing tyranny, death and war. People from many parts of our world particularly Syria are pouring into Europe with very little means of support but they are coming in the hope that somehow people will help them in their need.

We are part of that hope and how we respond to this as followers of Christ is up to us all. Over the coming weeks we will respond and strive to help these people to carry the cross that they have been given.

#### A Pebble:

Drop a pebble in the water: just a splash, and it is gone; But there's half-a-hundred ripples circling on and on and on. Spreading, spreading from the centre, flowing on out to the sea. There is no way of telling where the end is going to be.

Drop a pebble in the water: in a minute you forget, there are little waves a-flowing, and there's ripples circling yet. Those little waves a-flowing to a great big wave have grown; you've disturbed a mighty river just by dropping in a stone.

Drop a word of cheer and kindness: just a flash and it is gone; But there's half-a-hundred ripples circling on and on and on. Bearing hope and joy and comfort on each splashing, dashing wave. Until you wouldn't believe the volume of the one kind word you gave.
