

Seasons

Very recently we celebrated the beginning of Spring with the Feast day of St. Brigid. Spring is the season of renewal and rebirth. It is a time when the days get longer, we have more light and it is the time when all the buds of nature come alive in the celebration of creation. It is a time of the dancing daffodils and the reawakening of the earth. Like the earth it is a time for us to make new beginnings and changes. It is a time of cleaning out and making way for fresh possibilities and new commitments. The earth is being renewed by God and just as the earth is being renewed we too are entering into that season of, **Lent.**

From the time when we were children the big question was "What are you giving up for Lent" and invariably we would answer sweets, chocolates and lots of other things that we really liked. This all helped us

as children to be aware that we were in a different season; it brought us a sense of awareness of change and helped us to enter into this with a sense of purpose. This was the custom of that time and it still is. When you ask children today the same question you will usually get the same answers.

As adults we would usually say the same. But Lent is more than "giving up" something. It is a time of Renewal, a time of Reflection, a time of Realisation. It is a time of Spiritual Renewal, of taking time to listen and do something that will help us to grow in our faith and our love of God. It is a time to reflect on what kind of relationship we have with God and others. We listen to the Gospel every Sunday, we hear the words but how often do we really reflect on what God is saying. He is talking to each one of us, are we listening?

Lent is a time when God wants to give us something but we have to listen and have that conversation with Him. If we take time to reflect it might help us change in our attitudes. When we take time to reflect we come to realise the unconditional love that God has for us and how he shows that love for us time and time again. So much so that he sent his Son to show us the way.

So, let us take time to listen, reflect and in this way realise that this special season gives us a chance to renew our relationship with God and others.

Change of Practice!

As always, those who are Gluten Intolerant (Ceoliac) are invited to receive a 'Low-Gluten' host at Communion time. In the interest of best liturgical practice and following on from a recent publication from the Irish Bishops we want to make a small change as to how those who are Gluten Intolerant are to receive the Host. Beginning on Sunday next, 21st February we will be asking those who wish to receive a 'low-gluten' host to come forward as soon Eucharistic Ministers are receiving the communion themselves. A Eucharistic Minister who will have just washed their hands and not yet touched a regular Host will minister to you. This will honour the best practice of 'Receiving Communion' rather than having to serve yourself, and also avoid cross contamination with the regular Hosts. This practice will begin on Sunday next, 21st February and thank you for your cooperation.
