FATIMA, RUSSIA AND POPE ST. JOHN PAUL II



Mary's presence in the events of 1991.

A simple study of the events surrounding the apparitions at Fatima in Portugal in 1917, shows them perhaps to be the greatest of all supernatural events that occurred during the 20th century. Last weekend, on October 13th, we marked the 100th year anniversary of the miracle of the sun, where God, through Our Lady's intercession, permitted the sun to spin away from its normal axis and radiate so powerfully that the soaked earth and the gathered multitude, were rendered dry after the ten minute phenomenon.

Less well known are the continuous miracles, worked on earth through the intercession of Our Lady of Fatima, that not only changed hearts and minds forever but the dangerous political landscape that threatened humanity during the cold war. This intervention of Our Lady was never more apparent than during the days of 19th—22nd August 1991. She had promised the children that once Russia was consecrated to her Immaculate Heart by the Holy Father and the College of Bishops in union with him, that country would be converted, a period of peace would be granted to the whole world and we would witness the triumph of her Immaculate Heart. This consecration was made on 25th March 1984 and according to Sr. Lucia herself, was accepted by Heaven. This set in place a miraculous chain of events which began to unfold with remarkable speed.

At Fatima in 1917, August was the only month when Our Lady did not appear to the children on 13th as they had been abducted and imprisoned by the local authorities. Instead she appeared to them on the 19th August at Valinhos, a small hamlet outside the village of Fatima. In was on this very day in 1991 when a coup was launched against President Gorbachev, a day also given to the memory of St. John Eudes, the first priest to ever celebrate a Mass and Divine Office in honour of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Having lasted only two days, the coup collapsed on August 21st at about 6.30pm within the first vespers of the Feast of the Queenship of Mary. The unexpected final dissolution of Marxism and the Communist party was set in motion on August 22nd which is so significant because that day was originally instituted as the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary by Pope Pius XII in October of 1942. Later, in line with God's wish made known to Sr. Lucia, this feast day was moved to rest alongside the Feast of the Sacred Heart in June and the Feast of the Queenship of Mary was instituted for celebration on this day. On December 8th, President Yeltsin announced that the old USSR would be replaced with a commonwealth again demonstrating the presence of Mary at an important moment in the process of historical change. December 21st saw the dissolution of the USSR and on Christmas Day 1991, the hammer and sickle was lowered for the last time to be replaced by the red, white and blue flag of the commonwealth.

Looking back over this extraordinary chain of events we can now see that this miraculous period of Our Lady's intervention into the history of the world, begins and ends with the two consecrations of the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary by the two great Marian Popes of the 20th century.

Annual Remembrance Mass remembering all Parishioners who have gone home to God since this time last year and for all our deceased Loved Ones, will take place on Friday 10th November at 7.30pm in the Church of Our Lady and St. David, Sallins Road, Naas. We especially welcome all those who are going through grief at this time in the hope that our support through prayer and friendship may somehow ease the pain. *All are most welcome.*
