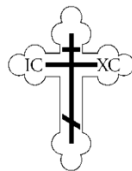

## **New Missal - New Texts**

During the past number of weeks we have all been getting used to changes in the responses at Mass. Hopefully we will be able to make the new language part of our celebration of Mass over the coming years.

On 27th November, the 1st Sunday of Advent, the full revised Mass texts will be used. The Scripture Readings will remain the same as those currently in use.

Many people like to have their own Missal or Mass Book which they can use to follow Mass. Two possibilities are available in our local Veritas Shop:

1. The St. Paul Sunday Missal is specially arranged for the year 2012 beginning with Advent 2011. This gives texts of the full Mass along with the prayers and readings for all Sundays and Feast Days of the year, arranged by the particular dates for 2012. It costs €7.95 and would need to be replaced at Advent 2012.
2. The CTS Peoples Missal is a missal which contains the three year cycle of readings for Sundays and Feast Days. This means it does not need to be changed each year. This Missal will be available before Advent in Veritas and should cost around €22 for the Sunday Missal and €53 for the Daily Missal.
