Together in Mission!

"Proclaiming the Gospel belongs to the entire Church as the Church is missionary by her very nature. The men and women of our time, perhaps at times unconsciously, ask believers not only to 'speak' of Jesus but to 'make Jesus visible,' to make the Redeemer's Face shine in every corner of the earth as they bear witness that they have found in Jesus the meaning and truth about their life." This is what Pope Benedict has said in his letter for Mission Sunday. It poses a great challenge to each of us who try to follow in the footsteps of Jesus Christ. Our task is not only to 'speak' about Jesus but to 'make Jesus visible' in the bits and pieces of our everyday lives.

Our country has a long and proud tradition of supporting World Missions. Down through the decades, Irish men and women gave their lives to bring the message of the Gospel to other cultures; through service in education, healthcare, parish, agricultural work and emergency assistance. Many still continue this great work of "sowing seeds" of a better future for generations to come.

On "Mission Sunday" we get the chance to celebrate these people who left the familiarity of their homeland to spread the Gospel in so many different parts of the world. Despite the fall in numbers, many still follow this vocation as priests, sisters and lay men and women. Today is a chance to remember them in prayer and to support them with financial assistance. The theme of this year's "Mission Sunday" is *Together in Mission*. We too are united in this missionary project. Irish people have, as always, been extremely generous in supporting the missions down through the years, and we continue to try to do this even in the difficult financial circumstances we find ourselves in.

However "Mission Sunday" also gives us the opportunity to reflect upon our own 'mission' in life. I might ask myself the question, emerging out of the pope's statement; "How am I 'making Jesus visible' in my own life at this point in time?"
