Advent expectation...

Advent is a time of new beginning, a time of expectation. What does the Lord expect from us? Are we ready to meet his expectations? In the Gospel Jesus tells a story that would have been familiar to his followers -- the necessity for labourers to be ready for action and ready to give their best when the master returned from his journey. Were these servants excited or anxious about their master's return? The watchful servants looked forward to the future because they knew their master would be pleased and would reward them for their vigilance and hard work. Disaster and reprisal, however, awaited those who were unprepared because of carelessness or laziness.

Our Master, the Lord Jesus, entrusts us with his gifts and grace and he expects us to be ready for action and be prepared for the future. Our call is not only to believe, but to watch; not only to love, but to watch; not only to obey, but to watch! What are we to watch for? The greatest event to come -- the return of our Master and Lord. We must also be watchful of his coming into our hearts and lives in a new way every day.

The kind of watching our Lord has in mind is not a passive "wait and see what happens" approach to life. The Lord urges us to be vigilant and to be active in prayer that his "kingdom may come" and his "will be done on earth as it is in heaven". We are not only to watch for Christ, but to watch with Christ. The Lord wants us to have our hearts and minds fixed on him and his word. He wants us to be ready for his action and grace in our lives and in our world. Those who "wait" for the Lord will not be disappointed. He will surely come with his grace and saving help.

Do you watch for the Lord's action in your life with expectant faith and with joyful hope?

The Advent Wreath:

The origins of the Advent Wreath go back to ancient pre-Christmas Germanic peoples of Northern Europe. Many found it an attractive way to support their Advent prayer and devotion, so the practice was Christianised. The use of the wreath with candles representing the four weeks of Advent was especially good for family devotions, for children could light the candles, one by one, to symbolize the growing anticipation as Christmas grew near. Traditionally the wreath is made of four candles in a circle of evergreen. Three candles are violet and the fourth is rose. Each day the candle is lit with a short prayer.....one candle for the first week and then another for each succeeding week until Christmas Day. The meaning of the advent wreath is;



'There is light in the darkness of the world'.
