The origins of the Advent Wreath go back to ancient pre-Christian Germanic peoples of Northern Europe. these people became Christianised the practice died out. Within the last 200 years historians rediscovered this practice through their research. Many found it an attractive way to support their Advent prayer and devotion, so the practice was Christianised. The use of the wreath with candles representing the four weeks of Advent was especially good for family devotions, for children could light the candles one by one to symbolize the growing anticipation as Christmas grew near. Traditionally, the wreath is made of four candles in a circle of evergreen. Three candles are violet and the fourth is rose. Each day the candles are lit with a short prayer.....one candle for the first week and then another for each succeeding week until December 25th. The meaning of the advent wreath is: "There is light in the darkness of the world".
