Exploring the Season of Lent

Lent — a time set aside by the Catholic Church for spiritual renewal and reflection on Christ's passion and resurrection—is the logical liturgical season to explore what it means to serve others.

Rather than concentrating on ourselves ("Should I give up chocolate for Lent or coffee?"), why not walk around the neighborhood and pay attention to what we see? Are there elderly neighbors who need help with their houses or yards? Are there youngsters in our circle of influence who could benefit from organised sports or after-school tutoring? Are there service programs within a few miles of our home that need volunteers? Today the Internet makes it possible for us to do a simple search to find where we can take our extra clothes and furniture.

where we can help distribute food, and where faithbased programs provide social services and support. All the above types of action are known in the Catholic faith as acts of Christian charity or service and are common Lenten disciplines.

Following Jesus' Example: Another way to help us emulate Christ's humility and service during Lent is to renew our friendship with Christ through scripture reading, prayer and reflection. The guided prayer program, *Meeting Christ In Prayer*, helps us to do just that.

Putting Others First: Through the reflection and repentance that mark Lent, we hope to clear out our personal clutter and start fresh with Easter, to become more whole and more holy. All of this requires that we step back from ourselves and get a clearer perspective. Nothing helps us step back better than focusing on someone besides ourselves.

Humility Benefits Everyone: Finding the means to serve other people, we benefit those people in the help we offer them. We benefit ourselves in balancing our interests and energy. And we benefit the Kingdom of God, simply by living more as Jesus did.

When we follow Jesus' example of humility during Lent—everyone wins.

LENT 2017..... AN INVITATION TO JOIN US!

Lent a time to take stock and reflect, to enter more deeply into the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

Lent is about what you do! We hope you can join us for some of the following:

- **Additional Evening Masses:** For the duration of Lent, in the Church of the Irish Martyrs, Ballycane Mass will be celebrated on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday evenings at 7.30pm.
- **Also on Friday Evenings** Mass in the Church of the Irish Martyr's Ballycane at 7.30pm will be celebrated by candlelight followed by a half hour period of **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.**
- The Little Blessings Children's Liturgy Group: On each Sunday of Lent during the 10.30am Mass in the Church of the Irish Martyr's, Ballycane, the children will be invited to participate in a child friendly look at the Gospel.
- **Scripture Reflection** with Sr. Peggy continues on Tuesday mornings during Lent, after the 10am Mass in the Parochial House. **Please note the venue** (blue door next to the parish office).
- **Stations of the Cross** each Friday afternoon during Lent at 2.15pm in the Church of Our Lady and St. David, Sallins Road led by the Legion of Mary. **Parishioners may like to join in with us on the Parish Radio.**

What is the Garment of Pain? The Garment of Pain is a simple way of drawing together the experience of pain of many people in a way that we may support one another in prayer.

How does it work? Over the period of Lent we will invite you to place a piece of material - roughly the size of the template **Below** - in the baskets provided in the churches. The cloth represents whatever your particular pain in life happens to be. During Lent we will remember in all our Masses the intentions of those who have placed their cloth in the baskets. During the final days of Lent the pieces will be sewn together to form one big Patchwork Quilt. During the Mass of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday we will place the cloth on the altar to symbolically unite our suffering with the offering of Christ in the Mass. On Good Friday the cloth will be draped over the Cross which is the focus of our prayer that day. It will also be used during the Easter Vigil.

Please cut along the outer dotted line as the template for your piece of material to be used in the Garment of pain.
