


Allowing God to transform us

Today as we reach the half way point on our Lenten journey, we remind ourselves that we are in a season of renewal, a time of hope.

Human nature dictates that we are all guilty at times of getting things out of proportion, of over-reacting, of saying or doing something we later regret. This may happen in the workplace, in the community or in the home. How often do we justify our behaviour and simply let the issue fizzle out rather than make the conscious effort to reconcile with another. Our failure to do so means we sometimes close our hearts to those around us, giving in to feelings of guilt or shame, distancing ourselves from God. We can make the choice to renew at any time however the days building up to Easter Sunday are especially appropriate for repenting and reflecting on what Jesus Christ has done for us.

The central theme of our readings today is the free gift of salvation extended to us by God through Jesus Christ, his Son. In the story of the Prodigal son, we recognise God's infinite love and mercy as he welcomes home the son who was 'lost and is found'. As we continue our preparation for Easter, we are reminded of the importance of letting go of selfish and indifferent attitudes that impede our experience of our merciful Father in Heaven. The good news preached by Jesus, is not just about forgiving and being forgiven; it is, as Pope Francis keeps on reminding us, about joy! It is never too late to return to the Lord and with a contrite heart, seeking his compassion and mercy enabling God's plan for us to transform the way we now live.
