## New Parish Pastoral Council for Naas;

The current 3 year term of the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) has come to a close. We are now looking at forming the new PPC.

**PPC**, what is it? Basically the PPC is made up of representatives from the parish community who work in collaboration with the priests in the running of the parish in all of its aspects. The word "pastoral" basically means serving the needs of people.

How does it work? Regular meetings are held of the PPC (generally every 4-6 week). The PPC is divided into sub-groups, examples of sub-groups could be; Youth (e.g. Masses, pilgrimage), Liturgy (e.g. how various Masses and Sacraments are celebrated, music ministry), Communications (newsletter, website etc.), Visitation (e.g. elderly, nursing homes). We can have as many sub-groups as necessary.

Who can be a Member? Membership is available to people who live in Naas Parish and/or are involved in ministry in the Parish. We are all at different stages of the faith journey, however, membership of the PPC would obviously be for those who have some concern/interest/passion for the faith life and wellbeing of the Parish. People have different gifts and talents, the PPC encourages people to put these gifts at the service of others in our Parish.

How can I play my part? This weekend various people who have served on the PPC will speak at Masses. We are inviting nominations for membership of the new PPC. If you know of someone who you would consider to be a suitable candidate for membership of the new PPC (over 18 years of age), we ask you to discuss it with them and then nominate them on the forms available after Masses, (forms are also available from the Parish Office, Sallins Road and available to download from our parish website; <a href="https://www.naasparish.ie">www.naasparish.ie</a>.)

**Next Step?** Those who are nominated will be invited to an information meeting in the Parish Meeting Rooms, Sallins Road, (above the Veritas Shop) on Tuesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> November. At this meeting we will outline in more detail what the PPC is about, <u>then</u> people can decide if they wish to commit to the new **PPC** or not. We hope to commission our new PPC on Sunday, 27<sup>th</sup> of November, the First Sunday in Advent.

Thank you for taking the time to reflect upon this important step in the life of our parish.

New Missal Two weeks ago we recommended two Missals or Mass Books which are available from the Veritas Shop. One, the St. Paul's Sunday Missal, lasts for one year and is priced at  $\epsilon$ 7.95. The second one is the C.T.S. Sunday Missal, which has the readings for the three year cycle and so is a permanent option. It is expected to be available in the next few weeks. A third option is also available for those who would like to have something more. It is called Magnificat and is available in monthly pocket size volumes by subscription through the Irish Catholic. Each monthly volume contains the Mass texts and readings for that month along with the Divine Office, that is the daily prayer of the Church, and spiritual reading. ## International Eucharistic Congress, June 2012 Theme; The Eucharist: Communion with Christ and one another.

Next June the International Eucharistic Congress will take place in Dublin from the 10th to the 17th June. Most of the event will be held in the RDS with the final Mass in Croke Park on Sunday, 17th. Each day of the Congress will focus on a certain theme; Monday; Baptism, Tuesday; Marriage and Family, Wednesday; Ministry (ordained and lay), Thursday; Justice and Reconciliation, Friday; Suffering, Saturday focuses on Our Lady.

Each day will include such things as Morning Prayer, workshops, exhibitions, prayer space, youth space, testimonies, liturgies and of course the celebration of the Eucharist.

Since this is such a big event, with many practicalities to be worked out, early planning is essential. Our parishes of Naas, Sallins and Two Mile House are now looking at how we will participate in the event. There are different options offered to people if they wish to attend. We will try to outline these options as clear as possible here.

- There are two venues; Most of the event will take place in the RDS in Dublin (10th-16th June). The final Mass will be celebrated in Croke Park (17th June).
- If you wish to attend the seven days and book before November 30th, the cost amounts to €85 and an additional €10 to be eligible to request admission to the closing Mass in Croke Park.
- You can attend for three days; Consecutive days between 10th 16th June, again the cost before November 30th is €50, with an additional £10 to be eligible to request admission to attend the closing Mass in Croke Park.
- The Kildare and Leighlin Diocesan Day is the Tuesday, so we would encourage people from the Diocese, who are planning on a three day participation, to attend the three days earlier in the week.
- The final Mass in Coke Park is a separate event (except for those who have paid €10 before November 30th and are eligible to request admission). Those wishing to attend Croke Park *only* will fill in an application at a later stage.

One day registration will be possible to book from January. Costs increase after November 30th.
