Baptism – What is it about?

We celebrate the baptism of the Lord today, a very significant moment on his journey. In this action of being baptized, Jesus was pointing the way for the rest of us to follow. It is a very significant moment for us too. Nowadays there is a lot of debate around this sacrament as for some it has become a mere social event. It is important to celebrate the sacrament with family and friends, but it is all the more important to reflect on what this sacrament is all about and the implications it has on our journey of life and faith.

So what actually happens to us at Baptism? One would need a lot more space to outline this, but in summary, there are a few basic points to be made;

- The Church sees Baptism as the first important step on the Christian journey.
- On the day we were born, we were welcomed into our family.
- On the day of baptism we are welcomed into the bigger family of the Lord, the Parish or the Church, which is the Body of Christ.
- In baptism we enter into a unique and special relationship with the person of Jesus Christ and we try to live out that relationship in and through the people around us.
- On the day Jesus was baptised by John in the river Jordan, He received his mission from His
 Father, the same happens to us. The words of the Father were; "This is my Son, the beloved,
 my favour rests on him". The same words are addressed to us by God the Father at baptism.

Or put another way ... In Baptism we become.....

- A son/daughter of God the Father
- A brother/sister of Jesus Christ
- A temple of the Holy Spirit
- A member of God's family, the Parish, the Church

In baptism we are called to the mission of Jesus Christ. That is quite a lot to reflect upon as we begin a new year! We are left with the questions; how am I living out my baptismal call in my life today? Am I living the mission Jesus has called me to in baptism?
