

THE ROLE OF CONSCIENCE

On the 25th May you will be asked to vote on whether the 8th Amendment of the Constitution, which recognises the equal right to life of the mother and the unborn, should be preserved or repealed. In coming to a decision on an answer one must of course resort to his/her conscience which 'is the secret core of the person'. For those of us who profess to be Catholic it is important to remember that one must have recourse to a conscience that is properly formed and informed in the light of the faith we profess. 'Conscience is not merely somebody whispering in my ear; it is not just a feeling or an instinct. It is my judgement of what is the best thing to do in a particular situation'. By conscience we mean the sense of right and wrong, but also the obligations that follow from our understanding of what is right and wrong. Catholics must educate themselves to understand what is just and what is not and should seek out proper guidance and follow good examples.

Nobody should be forced to act against their conscience, the Church teaches, and it is true that a person could carry out a wrongful act with a clear conscience because they have mistakenly concluded that the act is right. But no one with a properly informed conscience could do this because they would know what they were considering is wrong. 'Conscience has rights because it has duties..., and one of them, for those who claim to be Catholic, is to follow the principles of natural law and of Christian ethics. A Catholic who is well-formed and has properly understood the doctrine of the Church on abortion can't appeal to freedom of conscience to dissent from a clearly defined teaching. It is a matter of consistency: 'In forming their consciences, the faithful must pay careful attention to the sacred and certain teaching of the Church. For the Catholic Church is by the will of Christ the teacher of truth. It is her duty to proclaim and teach with authority the truth which is Christ and, at the same time, to declare and confirm by her authority the principles of the moral order which spring from human nature itself.'

We must be clear in knowing that in repealing the Eighth Amendment of our Constitution we deny the foundation of all human rights. If we reject the venerable systematic hierarchy of human rights in favour of a dislocated pick and mix compilation, we then must be ready to defend any infringement upon the rights of another. In a society where anyone can elevate their right above another's right to live, the weak will always suffer before those who are able to assert their rights more strongly. As we celebrate our parish day of prayer for the protection of the eighth amendment and for the right to life of the unborn child, we do so emphasising 'that every human being, at every stage of life, has a fundamental and unalienable right to life which is granted by neither the state nor its people, but it is their absolute duty to protect it.'

Parishioners are invited to come and spend time with the Lord, praying for the protection of life at all stages. Exposition will conclude with Benediction at 5pm led by Bishop Denis Nulty.
