




"Dear God, you made many, many poor people. I realize, of course, that it's no shame to be poor.

But it's no great honor either!

So, what would have been so terrible if I had a

small fortune? "



The obvious question arises can one be rich and grow in holiness? Well if we think on the lives of ,King St. Louis of France, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, St. Thomas More, Blessed Pier Giogrio Frassati, St. Anthony of Padua and indeed on Joseph of Arimathea, a wealthy man who paid for Jesus's tomb, it is obvious that wealth was not an absolute hindrance to any of these people achieving sanctity.

Riches and wealth as well as poverty and hardship can be roads to holiness depending on how they are received and utilised. Yes, Jesus tells us that it is hard for any rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven if they are preoccupied with their wealth to the detriment of their relationship with God and neighbour.

Whilst it may be easy to see how charity, love and concern can be demonstrated through a distribution of any excess of wealth we might have, it is a little more difficult to see how extreme poverty and real need could achieve the same result. We will let Mother Teresa explain: "Sometime ago a man came to our house and he said, 'Mother, there is a family, a Hindu family, that has eight children. They have not eaten for a long time. Do something for them or they will die.' When I arrived at their house I could see the hunger in the children's eyes. Their eyes were shining with hunger. I gave the rice to the mother, and she took the rice. She divided it into two, and then she went out. When she came back, I asked her, 'Where did you go?' She said, 'Next door neighbour, they were also hungry.' What struck me most, not that she gave the rice but she knew they were hungry. And because she knew, she shared. And this is what we have to come to know.... Love, to be true, has to hurt and this woman who was hungry - she knew that her neighbour was also hungry, and that family happened to be a Muslim family. So it was touching, so real." (Mother Teresa)

So when we think of Tevye's desire to be a rich man we can see that it was for purely selfish reasons. Yet, as Mother Teresa shares "At the end of life we will not be judged by how many diplomas we have received, how much money we have made, how many great things we have done. We will be judged by "I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was naked and you clothed me. I was homeless, and you took me in."
