Good Friday Drama! We are all familiar with the proclamation of the 'Lord's Passion', usually delivered in three voices, from our attendance at the Good Friday Ceremonies each year. It is a solemn moment during which the journey of the Suffering Christ is recalled. The names of the central characters are all so familiar to us. We recall vividly the poignant moments of the Lord's Passion; moments filled with emotion, tenderness and deep human pain. We reflect on that journey to Calvary, where Jesus hangs upon the cross. Good Friday is so central to our faith, and this is obvious when

people stand patiently and reverently in line to either touch or kiss the cross.

This year in the Church of Our Lady and St David, we are hoping to have a dramatisation of the Lord's Passion. We need people to take on the various roles, including crowd scenes, approximately 30 - 35 people are required. When rehearsed and performed prayerfully it can be a deeply spiritual and moving experience. Digging Deeper, Living Lent - Stepping into Lent Together

What does Lent mean?

While we associate Lent with preparation for Easter, the word 'Lent' actually comes from the Anglo-Saxon word Lencten, meaning 'spring'. Every spring, Lent holds the promise of a fresh start and new life; this is a time when we can honestly look at our lives and take even the simplest of steps to turn back to and deepen our relationship with God and allow our faith to impact who we are in the world.

Lent, then, is a time of doing penance, of actively embracing the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. None of these are ends in themselves, they are all part of the process that leads us back to God.

Family Prayer Time - "A family that prays together stays together"

At Saint Peter's Square, during the Holy Mass for the Family Day, in October 2013, Pope Francis asked if people prayed together as families. He said "And all families, we need God: all of us! We need his help, his strength, his blessing, his mercy, his forgiveness. And we need simplicity to pray as a family. Praying the Our Father together, around the table, is not something extraordinary: it's easy. And praying the Rosary together, as a family, is very beautiful and a source of great strength! And

also praying for one another! The husband for his wife, the wife for her husband, both together for their children, the children for their grandparents....praying for each other. This is what it means to pray in the family and it is what makes the family strong: prayer."

We are inviting all parents/grandparents/children to Family Prayer Time with us in Ballycane Church on **Tuesday 3rd March** for a child-friendly introduction on what prayer is and how to pray together as a family, based on 'YouCat for Kids'.

On **Tuesday 10th March**, we will have a child-friendly and hands on exploration of the Sacrament of Baptism which Bishop Denis is emphasising in 'Digging Deeper' for Lent.

We will explore Confession for Families on **Tuesday 24th March** with 'story time' and introduction to confession for children, with an opportunity for the Sacrament of Confession.

Praying the Rosary as a Family will be explored on **Tuesday 31st March.** Followed by light refreshments and a chat! *All sessions take place from 7pm-8pm in Ballycane Church.*

Digging Deeper Living Lent - Stepping into Lent Together....

<u>Baptism and Lent</u>: Given the Lenten focus on baptism, in these weekly bulletins we are going to highlight some of the elements of the Rite of Baptism. We will take the Rite of Baptism for Children as our starting point while acknowledging the whole complex of Rites that make up the Rites of Christian Initiation of Adults. Baptism is the first of the sacraments of initiation which are Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

The Reception of the Children: What does it tell us about baptism and our faith?

The first action of the Church in the Rite of Baptism is one of **welcome**. Following the example of Jesus' own ministry, the Church welcomes the parents, families and, of course, the children for baptism. This typically takes place at the door of the church. It marks a welcome of the child not just to this sacrament but to the life of the Church itself and the sacraments of the Church. Within this welcome, parents share the **name** of their child and their commitment to sharing the gospel and their faith with them. Having declared their wish to have their child baptised, parents and godparents publicly make the **sign** of the **cross** on their child's forehead. This is the sign of our faith, the sign of the depth of God's love for us. It is a sign that accompanies us for the rest of our lives. How appropriate, then, that this is what we were marked with on Ash Wednesday as we set out on our journey to renew our baptism.
