



**Today is World Mission Sunday - 18th October:** This weekend parishes in over 120 countries will celebrate World Mission Sunday. World Mission Sunday is a direct appeal from Pope Francis. He is asking all of us to give what we can so that overseas missionaries can reach and care for suffering men, women and children. On World Mission Sunday, all Mass collections, including those from the most impoverished churches in the developing world, will be offered to help further the reach of missionaries and mission. The collection is a lifeline, not only to missionaries, but also the future of the Church. However, it is in jeopardy. The worldwide pandemic means that less of us can physically attend Mass, resulting in less offerings in the basket. Its implications for suffering overseas communities in the months ahead will be devastating. COVID-19 brings fear, but it also shows us that selfless and courageous actions are not reserved solely for saints. In fact, they can be found in every one of us, and that by standing in solidarity together we can do more. Please, if you can, be extra generous this weekend. Your kindness will be used in the coming months to support overseas missionaries who dedicate their lives to some of the most impoverished and overcrowded communities in the world. **November Masses - Remembering our loved ones:** Normally in November, we gather in the Church, on one Friday evening, to remember those people who have died in the Parish during the last year. We are hopeful that we may be able to do so again this year. However, to satisfy the government guidelines on social distancing we will be holding four Masses throughout the month in the Church of Our Lady & St David. We will be writing to each Family, over the coming weeks, inviting a limited number of family members to attend the Mass in which their loved one will be remembered. Any additional friends and relatives may join the Mass on the webcam. *In the event of the Churches still being closed, there will be no attendance in the Church and all family members and friends can join us on the webcam.*



During this time, the Rosary will continue to be recited before the 10am Mass, Monday to Saturday, in OLSD, commencing at 9.30am. **To mark the month of October**, the Rosary will also be prayed at 5.30pm, Monday to Friday, in OLSD. *We invite you to join us on Parish Radio, 107.3FM, or by Parish webcam only as the Church will be closed to the Public for the Rosary.*
