I think of the strength of the women in the Gospel following the death of Jesus. They were not paralyzed by the tragedy, nor did they flee. For love of the Master, they went to the tomb to anoint Him. Like so many women in this pandemic, they were able to hold it together, to get around obstacles in their path and keep hope alive in their families and in the community. Because they did so, they were the first to receive the astonishing news: "He is not here; for he has been raised" (Matthew 28:6). The Lord first announced the New Life to women because they were present, attentive, open to new possibilities.

Next Sunday, 25th April is Good Shepherd Sunday and we are looking forward to welcoming the First Communion children and their families to join with the rest of the parish community at the 11am Mass, at which we will pray in a very special way with and for all of them. Next month, on the feast of Pentecost, we will join with the Confirmation classes for Sunday Mass as they look forward to the celebration of their special

day in the autumn.

These are people who did not have the traditional 'Irish' Funeral and Wake. There were approx. 230 ribbons placed on the tree, all with a connection to Naas, Sallins and Two Mile House Parishes. Some of whom had loved ones living in the Parishes who asked for them to be remembered, some who died in a nursing home here, some who had a Funeral Mass in one of our Churches and some who went straight to the cemetery or

crematorium while no funeral masses were taking place.

We also thank our Funeral Ministers and JPII students who helped with writing the names on ribbon and the placing of ribbons on the tree - we greatly appreciated their help.



We pray for and remember all those who have died over this past year and we think of their families throughout this difficult time. We got wonderful feedback expressing thanks and we know that this simple initiative was deeply appreciated.
