

Parish Sacramental Preparation & Confirmation Retreats

This year has been a challenging one for many people, in many different ways, and it has been a year where we have had to find new ways to carry out much of our Sacramental Preparation.

As restrictions came into place, were lifted and extended, and as guidance from both Government and the Diocese tried to keep up with the changes, we decided, after consultation between the parish and our schools, that all celebrations of the Sacraments would be deferred until the autumn.

The principals, teachers and secretarial staff have been patient and supportive throughout the year as decisions were taken, as have the parents and families of the children and young people who will receive their First Confession, First Holy Communion, and their Confirmation later this year. We thank all of them for the effort that has gone into the preparation for all the Sacraments this year.



Last week, our Ceremonies of Light for Confirmation were held via WebCam in the three parishes; a very different experience, but our prayers for all the Sixth Class Confirmation Candidates in all nine schools in the parish were as strong and sincere as in any other year. Thank you to the classes who prepared the Prayers of the Faithful for these Masses, and to the students and parents who represented all of them at the Masses.



As restrictions ease during the month of June, we are delighted to be able to offer a Confirmation Retreat experience to all those preparing for Confirmation in our schools. After consultation with the principals, we have tailored these to suit the requirements of each individual school. Some have decided to have a celebration of Mass as a class, and to walk from the school to the church for this, while others have opted for a pilgrim walk in the footsteps of St Brigid, returning to our own churches in the parish to celebrate Mass as a class group. Each Retreat is in line with the school's policy and Covid 19 response, and each is planned in the context of the current guidance around Covid 19 restrictions.

We hope that all the young people will enjoy this step on their Faith journey, and that each of them will remember the experience as one of the good times they have had as a class during this year. Please remember all of them during the coming weeks in your prayers, and we will remember all our parishioners in our prayers during these special faith filled days.

I am with you...



Today's Gospel is often referred to as the 'Great Commission'. It contains the instructions of the Risen Jesus to the disciples to spread the Good News to the ends of the earth, to teach and to baptise 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'. As we celebrate Trinity Sunday today, we pay attention in particular to the very last words of Matthew's

Gospel: 'And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.' Jesus will be with his followers through the gift of the Holy Spirit, God's presence with us.

We read that some of the disciples were hesitant when they encountered Jesus on the mountain. They had lost him to death, and now he was risen and with them again in the flesh. They may have felt they weren't ready or able for the task he was handing over to them. These first disciples were an imperfect group of people, yet Jesus chose them to spread God's vision of love, compassion and justice throughout the world. Perhaps, like some of the disciples, we are fearful or doubtful. At a time when everything is changing so rapidly, it can be difficult to navigate our own faith journey, never mind communicate it to others. Yet we have Jesus' assurance that he is with us, with the love and strength we need. The Holy Spirit is at work, inspiring and guiding us, shaping our lives, helping us to make the love of God present to all we meet.

Places are now available in the new preschool at Brannoxtown Community National School (W91 NY67), managed by Busy Fingers Creche. Participation in the Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) scheme is free-of-charge for all children of preschool age. Children can participate in the ECCE Scheme from 2 years and 8 months and continue until they transfer to primary school (up to 5 years and 6 months at the end of the preschool year).
