The Legion of Mary Celebrates....



On Tuesday last a group of Parishioners gathered before the grotto of Our Lady in the grounds of the parish church, to simply pray the rosary. In doing so, they were marking the centenary celebration of the Legion of Mary founded by Dublin man Frank Duff on the 7th September 1921, just three months before the signing of the Anglo-Irish Treaty which was to bring into being the Irish Free State and spark a civil war that lasted into the early months of 1923. Beginning a career in 1908 with the civil service, the young Frank Duff was very adept when it came to his organisational skills, an ability honed by his 26 years as a civil

servant. An ability that would serve well in the founding of the Legion of Mary.

Frank had a deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin, and upon hearing of a local SVP group comprising a membership of men only and their work of visitation to cancer patients at the union hospital, Frank with others set about to establish a similar group whose membership would include women.

Meeting at Myra House in Francis Street they decided upon visitation to the women's wards of the South Dublin Union Hospital. They began this meeting with the rosary. This was the first meeting of the Association of Our Lady of Mercy, soon to be called the Legion of Mary.

Now in 170 countries, with over three million members. Today its members hold weekly meetings, where prayer is conducted and a weekly obligation to do two hours of voluntary work is generously undertaken. Such work includes visitation to homes, hospitals, prisons etc. While also supporting the work of the parish and the local clergy. In Dublin, the Legion of Mary set up hostels to offer refuge to the homeless and vulnerable.

One such hostel was Regina Coeli, where among its early residents was an unmarried mother and her child. It was Frank Duff's passionate belief that a way should be found to allow mothers to keep and rear their own children - a revolutionary idea at the time, as was positively recognised in the recently published 'Mother and Baby Homes Commission'.

The essence of the Legion is the theology of the Church as the Body of Christ. Christ depends on his members.

Mary brought Christ into the world in a physical way, now brings Christ to the world through the members of his body.

Duffs vision for this lay movement of people, ministering as Legionaries of Mary rhymes well with the vision of Pope Francis, of a less clericalist, more Synodal, mission-orientated, outward-looking Church.

In 1980, one year after the euphoric visit of Pope John Paul II, Frank Duff gave a talk in Dublin. It was just months before his death. Somewhat to the surprise of those present, he reflected that the church in Ireland was in the grips of winter - but he declared that one day, spring would come.

On Sunday 19th September, the Diocese celebrates Safeguarding Sunday. On this day we turn the spotlight on safeguarding and remind our communities and parish personnel that protecting vulnerable people is at the heart of the Christian message. Safeguarding Sunday is about creating an opportunity for parishes to find out all the positive work that has been happening in terms of safeguarding over the past year. Safeguarding in each parish could not happen without the commitment and work of many paid and volunteer personnel including local safeguarding representatives, sacristans, youth leaders, choir leaders and priests.

We remember those who have experienced abuse in our Diocese and remind people of the Towards Healing confidential and free counselling service, Ph. 1800 303 416, Monday to Friday 11am to 6pm. They provide face to face counselling, structured phone counselling, family counselling and a counselling helpline.
