First Holy Communion Day

Over the next few weeks over 400 children from will our schools make their First Holy Communion. Our parishes include Naas, Sallins and Two Mile House. Think of it, that is a cross section of communities. First Holy our Communion involves our Churches, parents and families, schools and parishioners.

We get sentimental when we think back to that day of our own First Holy Communion. What are the main memories that stand out? Think of

the people that were good to you. We trace our practice of the faith back to that time. Of course, there have been ups and downs over the years.

St John Paul II in 1994 addressed children making their First Holy Communion around that time. "Dear friends, there is no doubt that an unforgettable meeting with Jesus is First Holy Communion day, a day to be remembered as one of life's most beautiful." "The Eucharist, instituted by Christ at the Last Supper on the night before his Passion is a sacrament of the New Covenant, the greatest of the sacraments. In this sacrament, the Lord becomes food under the appearance of bread and wine".

This has been a difficult year and yet we pray that the special day will be "*most beautiful*". All of us should support in prayer, friendship and pride in our community, our children. How many of the 400+ children will you touch in prayer and friendship? This is a holy and blessed occasion for our parishes.

"Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these". (*Mk*. 10.14) **Prayers and best wishes to all who are making their First Holy Communion.**

Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church...

In these days, the Catholic Church throughout the world and in Ireland is beginning a series of conversations about what God wants of his people at this time. These conversations are often referred to as a Synodal Process. "Synodal" comes from a Greek word which means "walking together". On Sunday 17th

October we mark the opening of this Synodal Process entitled, 'For a Synodal Church: communion, participation and mission.' This Synodal Process coincides with the start of the two-year Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland which will lead, in time, to a National Synodal Assembly in Ireland. We pray that the next two years will be a time of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a consultative conversation. This will allow all people - both within the Church and in society at large, to share their insights into the Catholic Church in Ireland – past, present and future – so that we can prepare for a National Synodal Assembly in the coming years.

<u>Naas Lions Club Spectacle</u> <u>Recycling Programme</u> Since 1925, the Lions Club International has actively

provided support for preventable blindness in the third world. Through the Sight First Programme, Lions Clubs International have invested \$415 billion and aided 30 million people. The W.H.O estimate that more than 150 million people have uncorrected refractory errors, which can be quickly diagnosed and corrected with corrective lenses. For children, clear vision means a better education. For adults, it means greater employment opportunities, a better quality of life and less dependence on others. We all know that spectacles can be expensive and while in

the western world many of us will discard our spectacles when we need a change, our discarded spectacles can be recycled by the Naas Lions Club and be a life changing aid to others. The local Lions Club will leave a collection box for spectacles in the porch of the churches. These spectacles will then be sorted and graded for distribution to third world countries.
