Feast of Christ the King: Moment of Truth!

This feast dating back to 1925 owes its origins to Pope Pius XI, and his deep concern about the emergence of political ideologies in Europe: nationalistic and dictatorial in character, that later would manifest themselves in the tragedy of World War II. This moment of truth was the assertion of Christ Jesus as our Universal Lord and King. All other political regimes and peoples acknowledging Christ Jesus as their true shepherd.

A moment of truth? Perhaps the recent climate conference in Glasgow (COP26) is our moment of truth!

Reaction to the two week gathering in Glasgow has been mixed. Some politicians and commentators searched for the positives, while others, like the Swedish teenager, Greta Thunberg and our own Mary Robinson were less impressed by its resolutions. The agreement previously arrived at to limit global warming levels to 1.5°c seems an ever greater challenge after COP26.

For those who doubt climate change, I don't recall being able to go out and about in mid-November wearing just a jumper, or sitting outside enjoying a coffee. Something has changed!

One of the great voices today advocating care for the environment is that of Pope Francis. One of his first encyclicals, Laudato Si' was a clarion call to see the evidence and to take the necessary action needed to care for our World. He urges us to see the blessing of all living creatures. Neither to dominate, to plunder, or destroy but with a God-filled humility, to take care of the world in which we live, and to see it as our Common Home.

In a 2020 publication entitled 'Let us Dream' (The path to a better future), Pope Francis speaking in the context of the current covid pandemic had the following to say:

For a long time we carried on thinking we could be healthy in a world that was sick. But the crisis has brought home how important it is to work for a healthy world.

The world is God's gift to us. The biblical story of creation has a constant refrain: "And God saw that it was good" (Genesis 1:12).

"Good" means bountiful, life-giving, and beautiful.

Speaking of our world he continues:

If someone who loves you gives you a beautiful and valuable gift, how do you handle it? To treat it with contempt is to treat the giver with contempt. If you value it, you admire it, look after it; you do not disdain it; you respect it and are grateful. The damage to our planet stems from the loss of this awareness of gratitude. We have grown used to owning, but too little to thanking.

Is this our moment of truth?

Today is World Youth Day!

World Youth Day is celebrated by Catholic Communities around the World at the invitation of Pope Francis. This unique festival was initiated by Pope John Paul II in the early 1980s to honour the faith shown by young people from many different countries. In the early years, it was held on Palm Sunday in Rome, but it quickly developed into an international Festival of Faith which is held each year in Rome, and travels every three years to different locations. Young people from our own parishes have participated with their leaders at World Youth Day events in Cologne, Sydney, Madrid and Poland.

This year, Pope Francis has invited us to celebrate World Youth Day on the Feast of Christ the King. He reminds us of the great gift that our young people bring to the Church, and encourages us all to invest our time and effort in helping them to learn about and develop their faith. Today, we welcome and acknowledge the involvement of teenagers and young adults in our three parishes, and thank those in our Youth Ministry Team and our Parish Pastoral Councils who foster and inspire them to play a meaningful role in the life of their faith community.
