Christmas Message from Fr. Liam

s the Shepherds hurriedly made their way to the stable at Bethlehem, they were soon to be followed by the wise men. Entering the stable; the animals, the smells, the sounds and at the centre, Jesus, the newborn along with Mary and Joseph. Relieved faces, the worry and fear of closed doors now gives way to the joy and happiness of a safe delivery. Mother and baby safe and well. Now with the benefit of hindsight and history we know it to be a holy night, a sacred night. A truly heavenly moment in our history.

If the above scene was to be experienced today, the shepherds and wise men would probably be forced to witness this moment via Zoom or on FaceTime. Not quite the same! For those of us who feel comfortable attending Mass on a Sunday, the experience of being together, the nod or smile of recognition creates a feeling of togetherness, a sense of community.

As we walk in line to receive Jesus in Holy Communion, the consecrated host placed in our hands. There we touch, feel and receive, saying our 'Amen' to our Lord and Saviour. Mass on webcam, while filling an enforced absence, can never be the same as the experience of a community coming together. Praying with and for each other.

I was very struck by the boys and girls, who last Sunday (Bambinelli Sunday), brought the crib figure of Jesus for blessing. As they held the baby Jesus in open palms, those same little hands will soon, on First Holy Communion Day, receive Jesus in Holy Communion. May all the children and grandchildren of our parishes experience the joy, hope and excitement that Christmas brings.

My prayer for Christmas this year, amid the challenges and moments that are testing, is that the one gift we can all give to each other is the gift of 'kindness'. Kindness to self and each other! As Pope Emeritus Benedict once remarked, 'Your kindness is my home and the place where I feel safe'. Share the kindness of Christmas!

As priests we feel blessed to minister in Naas, Sallins and Two Mile House, where we experience such warmth, kindness and loving support.

We are blessed in the gifted, resourceful and generous parishioners who volunteer to take part in all aspects of parish life. Thank you! This Christmas, thank you also for your support materially to the parish and to us the priests of the parish. We don't take it for granted.

I want to acknowledge all whom we work closely with throughout the year; our parish staff who do such a wonderful job in the parish office and shops on the Sallins Road and in Ballycane. Our sacristans, both full time and voluntary. The various parish committees and all who assist in any way in our churches. Our heartfelt thanks.

Boxes of collection envelopes for 2022 are now available in the Church porches of the Naas and Sallins Churches. Please write your name and address on the first few envelopes that you use. This will allow us to keep track of your donations over the whole year and to contact you to see if you are willing to participate in the Charitable Donation Scheme.

This scheme allows registered charities to claim back the tax, already paid by their donors to revenue, on the money they give to the charity during the course of a calendar year. So, if you donate more than €250 in a year, the parish can claim back the tax you would have paid when earning the donated amount. This is estimated by revenue to be 45% of the donation.

For example, if you donated €300 in total during 2020, the parish receives not only the original €300 which you gave us but an additional €135 directly from revenue. This applies if you donate in any traceable way, for example, the envelopes, standing order or by using the online donations module on the parish website.

If you would like to participate in the Charitable Donation Scheme, please call into the Parish Office on the Sallins Road for more details or download the CHY3 form from the online services tab on the Parish website.

Envelopes for the Christmas Collection in support of the Priests of the Parish are available in the Church Porches in Naas, Ballycane and Sallins. Please place your Christmas donations inside this envelope and place the envelope into the normal collection boxes in the Churches. We thank you for your very kind support and generosity shown to us at all times.
