The sight this weekend and next of boys and girls dressed to the nines in their First Holy Communion clothes will evoke memories.

I vividly remember my navy blazer, with grey pants, white shirt and navy tie. Hair trimmed and cut into shape, yes! Once upon a time, I did have hair!

The priest who celebrated our Mass in Raheen was Fr. Barry Larkin, former Naas Curate and now PP in Suncroft. A small class of ten pupils: with prayers learned off, hymns repeatedly sung, and walking up the aisle for the very first time to receive Holy Communion, an exciting moment. In those days, when at Mass, you remained in your seat until your parents returned. This was before the practice of children coming forward with arms crossed to receive a blessing from the priest. So it was a big deal to stand in line with the grown ups and walk up the aisle for the very first time.

When Mass was over on that special day, with dinner at home and then a visit to the De Vesci gardens at Abbeyleix House. The obligatory ice cream and mineral was enjoyed.

In some ways, while life evolves and fashions change, some things still remain. The loving effort made by parents to celebrate and to make it a special day for their young child.

Of course attitudes to religion and faith have changed. Motivation is not always based on faith or its importance.

And yet amid changing lifestyles and a more secular society there is a truth that remains. A truth based firmly in our faith and tradition. A teaching firmly rooted in the person of Jesus Christ. As St. Paul writes

"This is what I received from the Lord, and in time passed on to you: that on the same night he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread and thanked God for it and broke it, and said 'This is my body, which is for you: do this as a memorial of me."

This teaching is the great gift of our Church, the belief that in Holy Communion we are receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus, truly present to us. Assuring us of his divine and loving presence in the world. Of Jesus who wants to bless and to be part of our lives so that we may know: his love, his encouragement, his mercy and forgiveness. Jesus is our strength, our hope and our great promise, that we are never alone.

I hope that the boys and girls have a truly wonderful day with their families, that they feel special, knowing that indeed they are loved by God.



We ask that you either send us a copy by email to office@naasparish.net, or if you call into one of the Parish Offices, we can take a photocopy.


