The Way of the Cross (Via Crucis)

What is the Way of the Holy Cross?

It is a traditional prayer or devotion in honour of the life, death and resurrection of Christ.

It shows the last hours of Jesus' life as well as the road he travelled from the moment he was condemned until his burial. This is presented in 14 key moments.



When it did start?

No: 1888

Since the beginning of Christianity, as a sign of devotion, Christians have wanted to walk the road that Jesus walked from Pilate's House to Golgotha. But for this they had to go to Jerusalem. Since it was not possible for everyone, the Christians brought the "way of the cross" to their home.

When should I pray this prayer?

This prayer is recommended all the time, but especially during Lent because at the end of it we have the Easter celebrations that highlight the suffering that Christ chose to endure out of love for us.

Why should I pray this prayer?

As humans, we tend to constantly look for evidence that we are loved, accepted and appreciated by others. We consider that someone loves us when they give up their own comfort for us.

In the past, man looked to God, as a judge or policeman who is ready to accuse and condemn him. Jesus, while on earth, presented a God who does not want the sinner to die but to convert and be alive.

On his way to Calvary, carrying the cross on his back, Jesus presents a God who goes on and even when,



according to human logic, God should condemn and punish, he chooses to love and forgive in the hope that the one who hits him, will understand and appreciate his kindness.

The Way of the Cross is an eloquent and significant proof of God's love for us, which aims to plant the seeds of divine love in us. Although it is good for us to know how much God loves us and always forgives us, it is not enough to make us happy. We need to practice this love in our relationship with others.

Jesus offers us example and help. When it's hard for us to practice it, let's remember his words

"If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me."

(Mt 16, 24)


